1) Challenge your own sibling, or another child you know (ages 3-12).

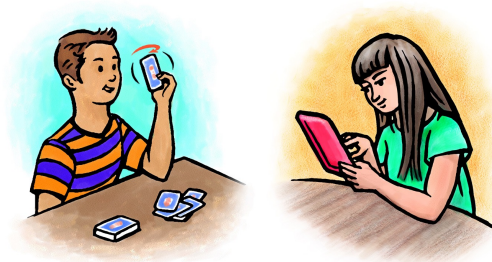
